





# Transformed! RELAXED MODERN KITCHEN

Fiona and Tim Peregrine have used a combination of polished granite and warm wood tones to create an inspiring kitchen in their newly extended Victorian home

### **THE PROBLEM**

Fiona and Tim Peregrine hated the long, narrow kitchen in their Victorian semi. The couple struggled to prepare meals in the cramped workspace, which was fitted with units that were falling apart.

### **THE SOLUTION**

Remove two of the exterior walls and extend out to create a large open-plan kitchen and dining area. Pull down the ceiling, reinsulate and put in two large rolled steel joists to support the new folding patio doors. Replace the

old fittings with glossy Parapan units, Zebrano veneered doors and black granite worktops for a contemporary look, with neutral porcelain floor tiles to reflect light around the room. Choose sleek-looking appliances and hang paintings for a splash of colour.

## **HOW IT WAS DONE**


'We saw the house in August 2006 and immediately spotted its potential, so we didn't hesitate in buying it, despite the huge amount of work that was needed to bring it up to date. Although the house was structurally sound, it hadn't been renovated in quite some time.

'We weren't in a hurry at that stage to get the whole house done, but as one job started, it created another and we soon decided that we might as well go for it and do all the building work at once to get it over with. It rapidly became chaotic, with builders everywhere dismantling walls and pulling down ceilings. We suddenly found ourselves living in a building site! However, I was glad to see the old units

ripped out of the grotty kitchen and when the two external walls were removed and the new extension built, we were amazed at the huge space it created.

'We knew we wanted clean modern lines in our new kitchen and looked at everything available on the market, from the high-end designs that we couldn't afford to budget options. My husband has an engineering background and drew up the plans to include everything we needed, so it was just a case of finding the right designer to interpret our vision.



I told him we wanted something with a very modern appearance, but with all the traditional dovetailing and handmade features behind it. His level of interest and commitment to our kitchen was amazing and really inspired confidence.

'We sourced our own appliances, and as my husband is a very keen cook, he insisted on a powerful Gaggenau gas hob. We chose Neff products from its latest range, which have very few dials or buttons, giving them a sleek look. We asked the builders to make a tall unit out of MDF to house the Liebherr fridge-freezer and painted it the same colour as the walls, so it would blend in.

'It took eight months to complete the house, but the kitchen was installed in just a week. When the large folding doors were fitted and the flooring laid we were astounded by the transformation. I couldn't wait to get my dining furniture in and hang our well-loved paintings. I feel this kitchen very much reflects our personalities because of all the numerous decisions we made to arrive at the finished result. I don't think we've done anything radical, but we've created a great space that appeals to everyone and it sits well within our home.

'The kitchen is great for entertaining friends and family, especially because of the folding patio doors that link it to the garden. It's also a really calm space, just wonderful for lazy Sunday mornings lounging around with a newspaper and a coffee. We have a TV in the room but rarely switch it on. My husband says it's as lovely as he expected, but for me it's better than I could ever have imagined.'
